Our enrollment number will increase in the 2023-2024 school year and the Center will provide early learning experiences to over 200 students.

These programs continue to add to the quality of our center, and we are eager to add more in the future.

Our team of teachers is dedicated to providing a quality care experience through continuing their education, implementing a social-emotional curriculum, assessments through the Early Learning Coalition, and participating in classroom management trainings such as Conscious Discipline.

Our goal at HSELC is to create a safe, enriched learning environment for our students to feel loved and supported – along with their families. As educators, we recognize how vital the parent's involvement is to the child's success in school. Afterall, a parent is a child's first teacher.

Part of our growth this year, was opening three additional classrooms in order to serve and reach more children in the Hobe Sound Community. With this expansion, an additional 54 students under the age of five, will have access to early childhood education.

With access, requires transportation, so we were committed to creating a plan of action to support our families in need. The Hobe Sound Community Chest graciously donated the funds for a 14-passenger bus which allowed us to further support our



mission of reaching those in need. Our bus transports families to and from school every morning and afternoon, with five bus routes total for each shift.

Thank you to The Loblolly Community Foundation for helping us prepare for the increase in enrollment by donating a second van to use for transporting additional families beginning in the 2023 – 2024 school year.

At Hobe Sound Early Learning Center, we absolutely love what we do, the difference we make, and the lives we continue to change – it's an honor to be a part of every student's journey as they graduate from our program – because as Bill Gates said "The first five years, have so much to do with how the next 80 turn out"


Last but certainly not least, we extend our heartfelt thanks to our donors. Your belief in the mission of the

Expansion Project

"UNFOLDING NEW CHAPTERS, EXPANDING POSSIBILITIES"

In 2019 the HSELC Board of Directors identified strategic priorities and committed to give all children in our community access to a quality, early learning experience. They saw a tremendous opportunity to increase our student capacity, reinforce the Center's infrastructure, develop additional staff, bring a full-time social worker on-site, and purchase a new bus. All of these improvements are allowing us to reach, nurture & develop the youngest members of our community.

Phase I which included two new classrooms with a dedicated therapy room, was completed in 2020. Additional teachers and support staff were brought on board to accommodate our increased student enrollment. With Phase I complete, the leadership team with the support of our Board of Directors and generous donors, began work on the second and largest phase.

As part of Phase II, we added three additional classrooms, hired new education staff, and employed an on-site social worker. Extensive upgrades were made to support the increase in students from 155 to 210. Some of these enhancements included expanding the electrical and power supplies for the enlarged footprint of the school, doubling the size of our parking area, and the purchase of a 14-passenger bus to transport children who otherwise would not have access to an early learning opportunity. The final piece of this plan was an extensive beautification project, meeting Martin County code and engineering requirements with the removal of invasive and the addition of new, non-invasive plant materials, and dry detention areas to allow for proper drainage.

Phase II was completed in June of 2022 in large part with the generous support of The Hobe Sound Community Chest, generous grant partners, thoughtful donors and friends who share our strategic vision of providing access and opportunity to all children.

Curriculum



FROG STREET PRE-K curriculum is a comprehensive, dual-language program designed to meet the needs of diverse learners while supporting developmental learning domains. This engaging, interactive pre-kindergarten curriculum celebrates the joy of learning as children travel down the road to success.



FROG STREET THREES provides intentional instruction in key areas of development so children ages 36-48 months can effectively continue the path to kindergarten readiness. This curriculum has well-rounded activities developed around early brain development research, addressing all development domains. It includes social and emotional emphasis through Conscious Discipline.



FROG STREET TODDLER nurtures curiosity through exploration. It focuses on enhancing the simple joy of childhood while equipping parents to nurture curiosity through exploration. This program is specially created for children ages eighteen to thirty-six months. The activities center around five development domains and differentiated instruction to meet the needs of all learners. It is designed with intention and purpose to move children forward in their development

Head Start & Early Head Start Programs

HSELC contracted with the Agricultural and Labor Program, Inc. (ALPI) to provide educational services to Head Start and Early Head Start families. Research has proven how important these formative early years are for children's later successes in school and life. This partnership removes the financial barrier many families face when considering an early childhood education for their children and helps to build the foundations needed to perform academically on their grade level.

Head Start programs support children's growth in a positive learning environment through a variety of services, which include early learning and development, health, and family well-being.

The child's entire family, as well as the community, is involved to create a quality program and assist the child with school readiness.



Conscious Discipline

Conscious Discipline is a comprehensive classroom management program & social-emotional curriculum. It is based on current brain research, child development information & developmentally appropriate practices. Conscious Discipline's foundation is built on the premise of developing discipline within children rather than applying discipline to them.

Conscious Discipline creates a compassionate culture and facilitates an intentional shift in adult understanding of behavior via the Conscious Discipline Brain State Model. It then provides specific brain-friendly, research-based strategies for responding to each child's individual needs. This highly effective approach is proven to increase self-regulation, a sense of safety, connection, empathy and intrinsic motivation in both children and adults.

For over 25 years, Conscious Discipline has fostered a fundamental shift in thinking that empowers adults and children to be the change they want to see in the world.

Embraced in 101 countries and 25 languages, Conscious Discipline's foundation of safety, connection and problem-solving is leading a revolution of the heart as concepts initially applied in the classroom extend to every aspect of our lives – and we are honored to call ourselves a "Conscious Discipline School"

During the 2023-2024 school year, Ginny Luther, Master Instructor, will host an 8-week Conscious Discipline workshop for our parents and the community. This will allow families to learn more about Conscious Discipline and the strategies and tools we use in our school.

Programs

ArtReach

The center's art program under the guidance and leadership of the Lighthouse Gallery, in Tequesta, engages children's imagination in the world of art. The ArtReach program offers children weekly interactive art instruction and materials to inspire their creative spirit. **This program is generously sponsored by the Hobe Sound Community Chest!**

Music Together® Class

This in-school curriculum raises the overall quality of a child's education by touching crucial factors all at once: school readiness, family engagement, parent-child relationships, and teacher professional development. When Music Together is a part of the school day, music is not just fun – it is a powerful learning tool, too! This program is generously sponsored by the Hobe Sound Community Chest!

Small Group Instruction

Our certified educator works directly with VPK students in small groups based on their skill levels to provide extra learning opportunities. Small group instruction has been a key factor in our success with students who are struggling with School Readiness Skills.

Parent Empowerment Workshops

These classes are "life changing" and help parents deepen their connection to their children and foster self-love, responsibility, resiliency and self-esteem. They provide young parents the tools they need to create a safe, peaceful & supportive environment in their home. We are enthusiastic about making these workshops available to all parents.

Technology

Classrooms were provided with tablets to help guide children through learning technology skills sets & utilize interactive programming to be prepared for kindergarten.

Bi-Lingual Program

Bi-lingual educators and staff open the lines of communication and prepare students to be fully engaged, informed, and aids in their achieving a level of inclusiveness that enhances their lives.

Healthy Meals and Healthy Minds

Every day, we provide a healthy breakfast, a warm & nutritious lunch and wholesome snacks to all children attending our Center. All meals meet the daily nutritional recommendations for children one-five years of age. Last year we served 63,216 free meals to our students. On May 1, 2023, the Center partnered with Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County's culinary program. The Fork in the Road program provides workforce development to youth in our community. HSELC is proud to serve meals prepared by certified, trained teens in Hobe Sound.









Voluntary Prekinderganten

Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) is a free educational program that prepares four-year-olds for success in kindergarten and beyond. The program has been offered at Hobe Sound Early Learning Center (HSELC) since 2005, the year of its inception in the state of Florida.

The school year program requires 540 instructional hours. Students who attend VPK programs can develop improved language skills, independence, score higher on school readiness tests, and have better social skills and fewer behavioral problems once they start school. Students perform pre-assessments and post-assessments to show the progress made throughout the year.

Our VPK students receive additional academic support from our Small Group Instructor. During small

group instruction, students participate in differentiated activities and are provided with individualized instruction based on their needs. Small Group instruction engages children and deepens their understanding in the areas of focus.

Mrs. Linda Shockley, Small Group Instructor, has been with HSELC since 1991. After 33 years of service, commitment, and dedication to the Center, Mrs. Linda has decided to retire. She has spent countless hours working with induvial students to ensure growth and progress in various subject areas. She has played a vital role at the Center for many years and although we are sad to see her go, we know this isn't the last we will see of Mrs. Linda.

TO PROVIDE QUALITY EDUCATION



CLASS is an observation tool that assesses the quality of teacher-child interactions in preschool classrooms. CLASS includes three domains or categories of teacher-child interactions that support children's learning and development: Emotional Support, Classroom Organization, and Instructional Support.

As an Early Learning Center who benefits from the support of the Early Learning Coalition of Indian River, Martin, and Okeechobee Counties, we are held to a higher standard of providing quality, age appropriate, programs and educational opportunities for our students ages one – five.

During the 2022-2023 school year, four of our classrooms were assessed and exceeded ELC's expectations! We couldn't be prouder of the dedicated team of teachers that we have here at HSELC! Our teachers are always finding innovative ways to inspire and engage their students. We feel incredibly lucky to have such a special group of educators that are committed to creating the foundations of a child's success in school by igniting the magic in learning and supporting their social-emotional development.

Community Collaporations

USING OUR PASSION AND KNOWLEDGE TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE 575

At Hobe Sound Early Learning recognize Center, we importance of a child's early brain development for building a strong foundation that supports learning. We believe that children thrive when we address their cognitive, emotional, and social needs. In order to ensure that each child's unique developmental needs are met, we collaborate closely with various community agencies specializing in early childhood intervention. Our cooperative partnerships promote a cohesive and united effort to support our children's growth.

One such agency we work closely with is the Florida Diagnostic and Learning Resources System (FDLRS), which plays an essential role in assessing children's abilities. FDLRS is equipped with a team of professionals trained and experienced in identifying a wide range of developmental challenges and learning differences. This expertise ensures accurate evaluations and effective interventions tailored to each child's unique requirements in order to address challenges. FDLRS offers an array of services including speech therapy and occupational therapy. Families are able to receive multiple forms of support under one organization, streamlining the intervention process and reducing the need for families to navigate various agencies separately.

Another vital community partner is **Tykes and Teens**, which focuses on supporting the emotional well-being and mental health of our young learners. Partnering with Tykes and Teens provides valuable insights and strategies that assist teachers, parents, and caregivers in fostering children's emotional resilience and social competency. An assigned therapist meets with children enrolled in the program, on-site at the Center, once a week for individual sessions in which parents can also participate. This early emphasis on emotional well-being sets the stage for healthy relationships, effective communication, and self-regulation skills that are crucial for a child's overall development.

We are also proud to work in conjunction with **Helping People Succeed**, an agency known for its outstanding behavioral program. This partnership strengthens our commitment to providing a comprehensive educational experience. Their behavioral programs work closely with families to provide effective strategies for managing behavioral challenges that may arise. Their evidence-based approach equips our teachers with the tools to address behavioral issues sensitively and proactively, which also enriches the learning environment.

We believe in fostering relationships with our parents and caregivers so that they are actively engaged in their child's development and are included in every step. 
